Measuring SMYAL's Impact



Housing

SMYAL provided housing, resource navigation, and case management to 54 residents.



Street Outreach

SMYAL expanded and strengthened its bilingual street outreach program through partnerships with Capital One and two community organizations. From July to December 2023, the program has supported over 70 youth!



Workshops and Trainings

SMYAL supported 22 trainings to 26 different organizations to ensure that we have created culturally competency throughout the district.



Camp Free2Be

In July 2023, Little SMYALs partnered with Camp Free2Be and was able to send **40 youth** to camp for free!



Mental Health

This year, **37 clients** successfully completed their therapy journeys at SMYAL.



Drop-In Programs

Drop in Programs engaged 176 youth ages 13-24 across inperson, virtual, q-chat, and special programming this year.

Youth Pride made its grand return for the first time since 2019 at Ballou Stay High School.

Youth got to see live performances, play games, win raffles and contests, and more!

Clinical Services

This year, SMYAL deeply invested in increasing access to affirming counseling by hiring a Play Therapist to work with elementary and middle school-aged youth as well as a Bilingual Therapist to more comprehensively serve Spanish-speaking youth.

16 % of SMYAL therapy clients received bilingual services since we hired our first Bilingual Therapist this year. As of December 2023, **SMYAL's play therapy program is at full capacity, serving 20 clients ages 6-12**. We currently have a waitlist for future play therapy spots.

Housing + Bilingual Street Outreach

In 2023, 15 Street Outreach clients received assistance in changing their names or gender markers and 52 received legal assistance.

The summit brought over 200 voices from across the housing space together in conversation with one another to share resources, perspectives, and identify areas to continue collaboration. 26th Annual SMYAL Fall Brunch
